

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER'S ACCEPTANCE
OF A SAFETY INTERVENTION GRANT FROM THE OHIO BUREAU OF
WORKERS' COMPENSATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, with adoption of Resolution No. 17-171 on November 14, 2017, this Council affirmed the City Manager's grant application submission to the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (OBWC) for a Safety Intervention Grant to assist with the funding necessary to purchase a magnetic manhole cover lift system; and

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2018, the OBWC notified staff that the City is eligible to receive said grant funding in the amount of \$1,971.75 or up to a seventy-five percent (75%) of the purchase price of a magnetic manhole cover lift system; and

WHEREAS, the City's electric division budget will be utilized to fund the required matching amount of twenty-five percent (25%) or approximately \$657.25 of the remaining cost necessary to procure the magnetic manhole cover lift system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: This Council authorizes the City Manager to accept funding from the OBWC in the amount of \$1,971.75 for the purpose set forth in the recitals to this Resolution.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that the aforesaid purchase must be made within an allotted time after receiving the funds in order to qualify for the grant; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
