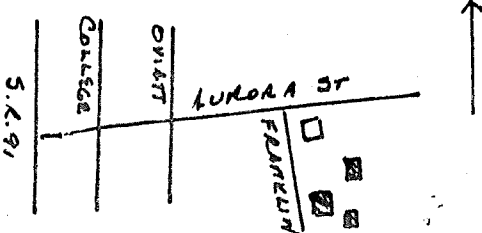

Further Description of Important Features Side gabled, returns, heavy frieze board; enclosed front porch added; enclosed back porch; handhewn beams and tree logs in basement; new floors, chestnut subflooring; crawl space under dining room and kitchen; original center chimney collapsed when house was moved, present one replacement; stairway originally surrounded center chimney, led to room in basement; tile roof replaced; corner posts, wide poplar wainscoting; Federal and Greek Revival trim, some replacement windows, wide board poplar					
43. History and Significance floors upstairs. Moved by James Ellsworth from present site of 180 Aurora Street, sold to Harry Cooper, gardener for Ellsworth. Counterfeit coins found when chimney collapsed during move.					
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings Operating greenhouse, originally low building; large addition to rear. Built around 1914. Detached garage. Residential area, close to Hudson High School campus; little traffic.
