

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH VASU COMMUNICATIONS INC FOR THE PURCHASE OF 800MHZ RADIOS, PAGERS, AND A SAFETY CENTER ALERTING SYSTEM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City Charter and ordinances and under State Law, the City Manager may purchase goods or services through the State Term Schedule purchasing program when authorized by action of Council; and

WHEREAS, the City has obtained a price quote from Vasu Communications Inc., under the State of Ohio Procurement State Term Schedule Contract Nos. 573004-0 and 534526 for the purchase of 800 MHZ radios, pagers, and a safety center alerting system for the Fire & EMS Departments, for a total cost of \$230,539.41.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized to enter into and execute on behalf of the City of Hudson a purchase agreement with Vasu Communications Inc. for the purchase of 800 MHZ radios, pagers, and a safety center alerting system for a total cost not to exceed \$230,539.41.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to purchase the communications equipment that is the subject of this Resolution so as to allow the public safety services of the City to continue to effectively communicate with one another; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
