A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN ADDENDUM TO AN EXISTING AGREEMENT WITH PIVOT MARKETING AND SALES FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES RELATING TO COORDINATION OF PUBLIC EDUCATION ON MUNICIPAL SERVICES AND PROJECTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Charter Section 6.04, the City Manager entered into an independent contractor agreement on November 19, 2020, with Pivot Marketing and Sales for professional services relating to coordination of public education on municipal services and projects in an amount not to exceed \$24,375.00; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that it is necessary to amend the aforesaid agreement in accordance with the City Manager's recommendation to authorize an addendum to the existing agreement to provide \$13,000.00 in additional funding for the continuation of important services, allowing for inclusion of certain expenses relating to Celebrate Hudson, outside the scope of the work that was originally planned for said agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: The City Manager is authorized to execute an addendum to the existing independent contractor agreement with Pivot Marketing and Sales to authorize additional services in an amount not to exceed Thirteen Thousand Dollar (\$13,000.00) for continued professional services relating to coordination of public education on municipal services and projects.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City, and for the further reason that immediate funding has been requested to provide for the continuation of important services relating to coordination and dissemination of public education on municipal services and projects; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present at the meeting at which it is
