

- SECTION 1. The Summit County Hazard Mitigation Plan for calendar year 2019, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of Council, is hereby approved and adopted by this Council.
- SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees

that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the Village, and for the further reason the Resolution must be effective and forwarded to the OEMA and FEMA at the earliest possible time; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon its passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
