Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act; and

WHEREAS, goals, objectives and strategies to mitigate against the hazards that have been identified in the County, including the City of Akron, have been developed; and

WHEREAS, mitigation measures for the City and surrounding areas have been analyzed and prioritized; and

WHEREAS, following adoption by the County and municipalities, the Resolutions adopting the updated Plan will be forwarded to OEMA and FEMA; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City of Akron to approve and adopt the mitigation Plan.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Akron:

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") has established rules and regulations under 44 CFR part 201.6, as authorized by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, requiring that local governments have a mitigation plan ("Plan") approved pursuant to the aforementioned section in order to receive Hazard Mitigation Grant Program ("HMGP") grants; and

WHEREAS, the Summit County Emergency Management Agency ("SCEMA") is responsible for updating the Plan every five years and has updated same; and

WHEREAS, the updated Plan has been reviewed by local agencies such as AMATS, police and fire chiefs, and the County Engineer and was approved by the Summit County Emergency Management Executive Committee; and

WHEREAS, the updated Plan was forwarded to the Ohio Emergency Management Agency ("OEMA") and FEMA and was approved by each agency; and

WHEREAS, the updated Plan has been adopted by the Summit County Council and sent to all municipalities in the County for adoption; and

WHEREAS, Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents and County to approve and adopt the aforementioned hazard mitigation plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Northfield, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Council hereby and herein approves and adopts the 2018 Summit County Hazard Mitigation Plan.

SECTION 2. That all formal actions of this Council and any actions of its committees that resulted in those formal actions concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in meetings open to the public in compliance with law.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, health, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Northfield for the reason that the Village is required by law to take action on this matter, and that this Resolution shall take immediate effect upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon the expiration of time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after its disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be, pursuant to Village of Northfield Charter Section 4.11.

WHEREAS, the Summit County Emergency Management Agency ("SCEMA") is responsible to update the Plan every five years, and has updated the same for 2019; and

WHEREAS, after update by SCEMA, the updated Plan was reviewed by local agencies such as AMATS, police and fire chiefs, and County Engineer, and was ultimately approved by the Summit County Emergency Management Executive Committee; and

WHEREAS, the updated Plan was forwarded by the Ohio Emergency Management Agency ("OEMA"), and subsequently forwarded by FEMA, and approved by each agency;

WHEREAS, the updated Plan was adopted by County Council on April 1, 2019 (Resolution 2019-119) and was sent to all municipalities in the County for adoption; and

WHEREAS, following adoption by the County and municipalities, the Resolutions adopting the updated Plan are to be forwarded to OEMA and FEMA; and




that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


