

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO REIMBURSE THE FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF HUDSON FOR EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH REPAIR OF STORM WATER INFRASTRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, sections of an existing storm water sewer pipe running through a portion of the First Congregational Church property began to show failure with several sink holes observed by the Church staff; and,

WHEREAS, this was a private storm system and no easements to the City were found for this existing storm line from Baldwin to North Main Street, across multiple properties draining a large watershed in the Baldwin and College Street area of Western Reserve Academy; and,

WHEREAS, the First Congregational Church paid the necessary repairs on their portion of the storm pipe; and,

WHEREAS, the City worked with the Church to ensure the repairs were completed correctly and advised the Church to submit the project expense receipts to the City for reimbursement review; and,

WHEREAS, during the past year, the City developed and implemented a “private property” storm sewer water policy under Resolution #22-80 for situations similar to this case.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. Once the First Congregational Church provides the City both an acceptable 30 foot wide easement over the existing storm line on the church’s property and a means of ingress and egress to the easement for future maintenance and so long as all such paperwork is approved and filed with the City and the Summit County Fiscal Office, the City Manager is authorized to reimburse the First Congregational Church for expenses associated with the repair of storm water infrastructure for the repairs on their portion of the storm pipe consistent with current City guidelines and rules.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
