

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (“TAP”) FUNDS PROGRAMMED BY THE AKRON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY (“AMATS”) TO CONSTRUCT THE VARIOUS PROJECTS LISTED HEREIN; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

TITLE: APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL TAP FUNDS

WHEREAS, the projects listed in Section 1 herein are of critical importance to complete in order to further the public health, safety, and general welfare at the earliest possible time to the City of Hudson, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the projects listed are in need of certain improvements as described in Section 1 below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The City Manager is authorized to apply for federal Transportation Alternatives (“TAP”) Funds programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (“AMATS”) for the following TAP projects:

- (1) Veterans Way Trail, Phase One; Veterans Way Park and Barlow Road
 - The work will include acquisition of property, the installation of a ten-foot asphalt path, grading, drainage, sediment control and decking where required by grade or environment. (\$1,440,000)
- (2) Veterans Way Trail, Phase Two; Barlow Road and the Summit County Bike and Hike Trail.
 - The work will include acquisition of property, the installation of a ten-foot asphalt path, grading, drainage, sediment control, and decking where required by grade or environment. (\$1,280,000)
- (3) Darrow Road (SR 91) Sidewalk Project; Faymont Drive to the end of the sidewalk near Stoney Hill Drive.
 - The project includes temporary and permanent right of way acquisition, excavation, grading, limestone base, concrete, drainage improvements, driveway replacement, misc. tree and vegetation removal/replacement, topsoil, seeding and mulch, handicap ramps, and maintenance of traffic. (\$387,000)
- (4) W. Streetsboro Road (SR 303) Sidewalk Project; Approximately W. Case Drive to Stratford Drive (end of existing sidewalk)
 - This project includes: temporary & permanent right of way, excavation, grading, limestone base, concrete, handicap ramps, drainage improvements, driveway replacement, misc. tree & vegetation removal/replacement, topsoil, seeding & mulch and maintenance of traffic. (\$340,500)

- (5) Boston Mills Road Sidewalk Project; SR 303 to Stratford Drive
- The project includes temporary and permanent right of way, excavation, grading, limestone base, concrete, handicap ramps, drainage improvements, driveway replacement, misc. tree and vegetation removal/replacement, topsoil, seeding and mulch and maintenance of traffic. (\$301,000)
- (6) Middleton Road Sidewalk Project; Winterberry Drive to Hudson Park Drive.
- The project includes: temporary and permanent right of way, excavation, grading, limestone base, concrete, handicap ramps, drainage improvements, driveway replacement, misc. tree & vegetation removal/replacement, topsoil, seeding and mulch and maintenance of traffic. (\$611,500)
- (7) City Wide School Bus Stops; various streets within the City of Hudson.
- the work will include the installation of concrete pad, shelter of the surrounding architectural style with benches and pedestrian lighting of the area. (\$75,000)

SECTION 2. The City of Hudson acknowledges and understands the AMATS “Funding Policy Guidelines” and confirms to the best of its knowledge that the information contained in the project applications is accurate, that it intends to diligently pursue that project, and that a local share is required to match federal funds.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meeting open to the public and in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety convenience and welfare of the City of Hudson and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is to apply for this funding within the next 5 days; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
