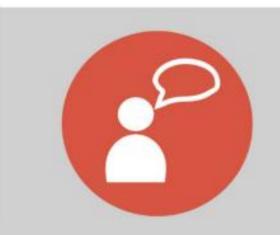

#### Statistically Valid Survey



The goal was to obtain 350 completed surveys from respondents. A total of 480 surveys were collected.



The overall results for a sample of 480 surveys have a precision of at least +/- 4.4% at the 95% level of confidence.



#### Online Survey



The online survey mirrored the statistically-valid survey's content and provided residents that did not take the statistically-valid survey the opportunity to participate.



The survey was open for four weeks:

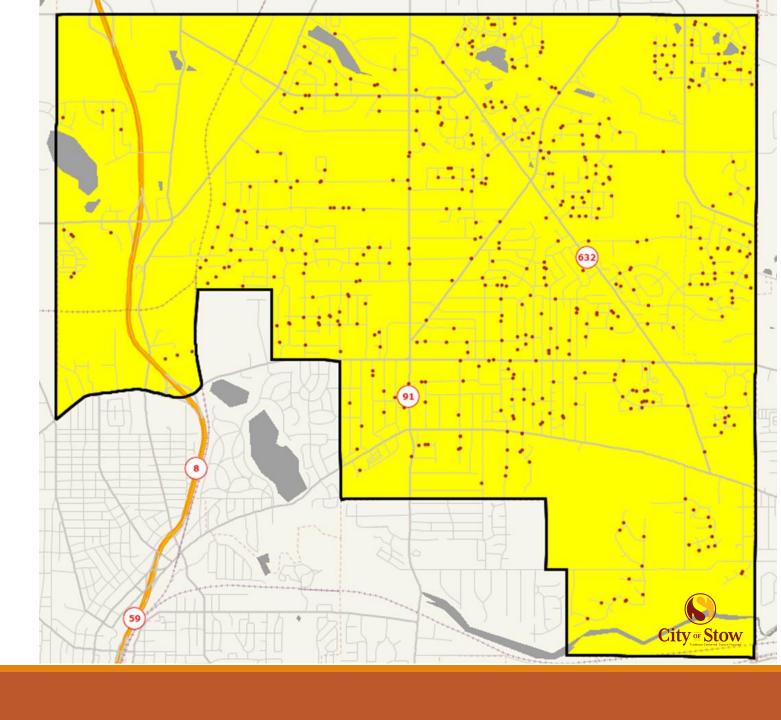
January 3<sup>rd</sup> to January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and received a total of 1,065 responses.

(by Census Block Group)

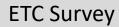
