

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT
THE DONATION OF “MELODY” FROM DOOR2ART.**

WHEREAS, in July 2022, the Birdsong project, a unique public art installation displayed throughout the Gazebo/Bandstand, Clocktower, and South (Ravenna St.) Greens received temporary approval from Council to display small bird sculptures hand-painted by local artists; and

WHEREAS, as a part of this project, Melody, a larger bird exhibit adorned with hundreds of small tiles painted by residents of all ages, was installed on the Park Lane Green in the Spring of 2023; and

WHEREAS, Melody’s stay on the Park Lane green was extended in 2024 to run through the end of April 2025, and three planters, filled with painted Kindness rocks, were added and dedicated to the community in the Spring of 2024 with the support of Art class students from both Seton Catholic School and the Hudson City Middle Schools; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor is requesting that the City accept “Melody,” the large bird sculpture, as a no-cost donation to the City of Hudson from Door2Art, a local art studio; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to accept “Melody” as a donation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City of Hudson hereby accepts the donation offered by Door2Art for the “Melody” bird sculpture, subject to any required terms or conditions as determined by the City Manager. Further, the City of Hudson authorizes the City Manager to and do all things necessary to put the same into use.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
