A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE ASPHALT PAVING OF THE HUDSON PUBLIC POWER FACILITY PARKING LOT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Hudson Public Power facility employee and visitor parking area is in need of asphalt paving to replace current limestone gravel material in an area consisting of approximately 20,000 square feet; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Council to proceed with this project in order to support the operation of Hudson Public Power Division located on Hudson Gate Drive.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

- <u>Section 1</u>: The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality, requesting the submission of bids for the Hudson Public Power Parking Lot Paving Project in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City of Hudson's Public Works Office.
- Section 2: The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of the City, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the projects estimate of \$50,000 for construction.
- <u>Section 3</u>: The City Manager is authorized to add a 10% contingency amount, based upon the construction cost, to the contract with the lowest and best bidder.
- Section 4: The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract or contracts if deemed necessary to do so.
- Section 5: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 6: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to complete this public improvement project to provide for the safety of the motoring public and to provide improved parking areas for employees, the visiting public, and City vehicles

at the Hudson Public Power facility during the current construction season; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
