A RESOLUTION APPROVING A THREE-YEAR CONTRACT FOR SUMMER FIREWORKS IN 2025, 2026, AND 2027, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A SERVICE CONTRACT WITH AMERICAN FIREWORKS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson has a tradition of hosting annual summer fireworks displays for the enjoyment of residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to continue this tradition by securing a reliable and experienced fireworks provider to ensure the success and safety of these events; and

WHEREAS, American Fireworks has been identified as a reputable and qualified provider for the City's summer fireworks displays; and

WHEREAS, American Fireworks has proposed a contract for the provision of fireworks displays for the summers of 2025, 2026, and 2027 at an annual cost of Twenty-Six Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$26,750); and

WHEREAS, entering into a three-year contract ensures price stability, continuity of service, and effective planning for the annual fireworks events; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to retroactively authorize the City Manager to execute the service contract with American Fireworks to secure competitive pricing and to facilitate timely planning and coordination for the upcoming fireworks displays.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager or his designee is retroactively authorized to enter a three-year contract for summer fireworks in 2025, 2026, and 2027 with American Fireworks for an annual cost of Twenty-Six Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$26,750) and all actions in connection with this agreement to date are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 2. That the above recitals and attached exhibit are fully incorporated herein.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City's residents, to timely secure competitive pricing, and to allow for the continued planning operations of the City administration and, shall, therefore, take effect and be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives an affirmative vote of at least six (6) members of the Council for its enactment if seven (7) are present, or an affirmative vote of at least five (5) members if only five (5) or six (6) members are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
