University Hospitals of Cleveland would like to donate a Lucas automated CPR device to Hudson EMS.

The Lucas Device is a mechanical CPR device made by the Physio-Control Corporation. It provides consistent, non-stop CPR chest compressions. Unlike humans, it doesn't tire out. Additionally, a human has to try to stand up in the back of a moving ambulance to do CPR en route to the hospital. This isn't required when one is using the Lucas Device. It is truly a better, and safer, method for performing this (potentially) life-saving skill.

University Hospitals of Cleveland has a large foundation which funds numerous community EMS grants and projects. We are very lucky to have been selected as a recipient. As you may recall, Hudson EMS was also the recipient of our current Lifepak Monitor Defibrillators, which were also graciously donated by University Hospitals of Cleveland several years ago.

I am very much in favor of The City of Hudson accepting this donation for Hudson EMS.

Representatives from University Hospitals of Cleveland would like to present the donation to City Council at next week's meeting, (Feb. 17, 2015).
