DAGGED

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH UNIFIRST CORPORATION FOR THE CITY'S UNIFORM AND FLOOR MAT PROGRAM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, competitive bids were solicited for the provision and maintenance of floor mats and employee uniforms for an initial term that will run through September 30, 2020, with an option for a two-year renewal at the end of the first term; and

WHEREAS, the UniFirst Corporation was the lowest and best bidder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with the UniFirst Corporation that will run through September 30, 2020, in an amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifteen Dollars and Ten Cents (\$20,715.10) per year, for provision and maintenance of the City's floor mats and employee uniforms and with the option to renew the contract for an additional two (2) year term, dependent upon pricing and quality of service, and subject to annual appropriations by Council for said contract renewal.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary for the City to enter into this contract so as to keep necessary City safety and service personnel properly outfitted for both their protection and the protection of the general public; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto, or six affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
