A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE MANOR DRIVE WATERLINE AND STORM SEWER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to repair and replace the existing water main and water service connections within the right-of-way and to replace part of the existing storm sewer system on Manor Drive from East Streetsboro Street, south to the cul-de-sac in the City of Hudson, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of at least two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality, requesting the submission of bids for the repair and replacement of the existing water main and water service connections within the right-of-way and the replacement of part of the existing storm sewer system on Manor Drive from East Streetsboro Street, south to the cul-de-sac in the City of Hudson, Ohio, in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's office.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract in an amount not to exceed \$695,000 on behalf of the City, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate.

<u>Section 3</u>. The City Manager is authorized to add a 10% contingency amount to the contract with the lowest and best bidder.

<u>Section 4</u>. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to complete the competitive bidding process for the subject work that is critical to

maintaining public safety and to do so at the earliest possible time so as to obtain the most advantageous competitive bids and to complete the work in the 2017 construction season; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto or six affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
