A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH ARCADIS FOR ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES FOR BRANDYWINE DRIVE AND BLACKBERRY DRIVE BRIDGES REHABILITATION PROJECTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Executive Summary: This legislation will retain Arcadis (consulting engineer) for the subject project in the base amount of \$137,500 plus \$2,500 in contingency, totaling \$140,000. The anticipated improvements which include: structural rehabilitation of the structures, improved channel armoring and improvement to the curbs, walks, aesthetic fascia and railing as needed. The City's ODOT approved process of Consultant Selection was used, which is a qualification based procedure. We received qualifications from two consultants: Arcadis and Michael Benza & Associates, Inc.
