A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FACT-FINDER IN CASE NO. 2017-MED-03-0447 (OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION – POLICE PATROL OFFICERS); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council has reviewed the findings and recommendations and determined to accept them.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: This Council hereby accepts the findings and recommendation of the Fact-Finder in the matter set forth in the preamble to this Resolution.

<u>Section 2</u>: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

<u>Section 3</u>: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the general welfare of the City and to memorialize this Council's acceptance of the Fact-Finder's findings and recommendations herein where state law provides a seven-day period in which to reject such finding and recommendations; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
