

Refuse and Recycling Hauling Cost Per Month





OBSERVATIONS FROM THE COMPARISON

- Refuse collection prices in Hudson are among the highest in Northeast Ohio for comparable populations
- All communities in Northeast Ohio require recycling plans
- Higher prices in Hudson are likely due to the smaller customer bases for the four independent haulers that operate in town
- Most cities in Northeast Ohio have a single hauler, with some providing centralized billing through the city
- Northeast Ohio communities with single haulers have larger customer bases that allow the haulers to charge less for their services and offer more variety
- Residents in several cities with single haulers can choose among service options
- Several communities in Northeast Ohio offer senior discounts, low cost, and/or cityprovided refuse service for low income residents
- The EAC suggests that we disseminate this information to Hudson residents and that we conduct a residential survey
