A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A LOCAL PUBLIC AGENCY ("LPA") FEDERAL LOCAL-LET PROJECT AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE DOWNTOWN PEDESTRIAN SAFETY (PID#120285).

Brief Description: When accepting State or Federal transportation improvements funding, cities, or Local Public Agencies (LPAs), are required to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation. The agreement outlines the terms of the use of the funding and requires the LPA to follow the State process for any project contracts. This LPA Agreement is for Phase 2 of the Downtown Pedestrian Safety Improvements which will be partially funded through ODOT Safety Funds and includes design and construction of various pedestrian signal, sidewalk and crosswalk improvements along Aurora Street, Main Street, Streetsboro Street, and First Street in the City of Hudson. Phase 1 has commenced with design and construction utilizing 100% City funds.

Brief Description: The State of Ohio awards biennial capital budget funding to support regional and local projects that demonstrate a state benefit in higher education, mental health, parks and recreation, conservation, and cultural and sports facilities. The inclusive playground proposal at Middleton Road Park would be a strong submittal as a local community group anticipates raising private funding for playground equipment, specialized turf and fencing on site, with the City responsible for infrastructure and site improvement costs. Through the State Capital Budget, the City could receive up to two thirds of the total infrastructure cost through reimbursement with a one-third local match requirement.
