

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A POLICE SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE HUDSON CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR POLICE PRESENCE IN ITS SCHOOLS FOR THE SAFETY OF STAFF, STUDENTS, AND VISITORS.

WHEREAS, the Hudson City School District desires to continue the School Resource Officer (SRO) Program through the City of Hudson and enter a new three-year contract; and

WHEREAS, the SRO Program is designed to provide for the safety of staff, students, and visitors and fulfill the overall roles of law enforcement, crime prevention, and education; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the expiring agreement, the City of Hudson Police Department provided three (3) school resource officers to the district, with two being provided by the City at no cost and the third being funded by the district; and

WHEREAS, the new three-year agreement maintains the same structure of the existing program, including the continuation of the third officer being funded by the district; and

WHEREAS, the City and the School District both desire to enter into a Police Services Agreement for the safety and well-being of the schools and the Hudson community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, as follows:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (i.e., a Police Services Agreement) with the Hudson City School District for a police presence at Hudson City Schools. This authorization and the Memorandum of Understanding shall be retroactively effective as of July 1, 2026. The agreement shall also be in a form satisfactory to and approved by the City Solicitor.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
