

RESOLUTION NO. 22-68

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF \$211,612.00 IN BROWNFIELD REMEDIATION GRANT CLEANUP/REMEDICATION PROGRAM FUNDING BY THE INTERIM CITY MANAGER FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Ohio Department of Development Brownfield Remediation Program is to provide funding for assessments and cleanup/remediation costs aimed at containing, removing or disposing of hazardous substances at a brownfield; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson, having identified the need for cleanup and remediation, sought funding for the removal of hazardous substances at the former Youth Development Center on Hines Hill Road, with a total project estimate is \$282,150.00; and,

WHEREAS, the City has been awarded \$211,612 from the Ohio Department of Development, which represents 75% of the total project cost; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson has committed to fund its local share of costs associated with the improvement, being a required match of \$70,538, which represents 25% of the total project cost; and,

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement herein above-described is considered to be a priority need for the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, Ohio as follows:

Section 1: The Interim City Manager and/or his designee are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to accept aforesaid financial assistance in the form of a grant from the Ohio Department of Development Brownfield Remediation Program to support the need for cleanup/remediation at the former Youth Development Center on Hines Hill Road.

Section 2: The Interim City Manager and/or his designee are authorized to sign any documents and/or enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for the design and construction services related to the proposed improvements.

Section 3: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 4: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed virtual, open

meeting of this Council and that all deliberations which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of City residents, to allow for the timely execution of the necessary paperwork, including the Grant Agreement, along submission of the Ohio Department of Development Brownfield Remediation Program grant documentation within guidelines and requirements, to allow for the prompt commencement of remediation efforts to begin when the weather will first allow, and to allow for the continued operations of the City Administration and other departments and shall, therefore, take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
