How do you intend to identify and allow only visitors' vehicles to use those new spots "for quick, convenient shopping trips or when picking up take-out meals." About the only control you have is to make more spots timed (ex: 10-minute max) to cater to the carry-out crowd, but that too requires more signage and enforcement. But you don't need more/new spots to go that strategy – just redefine the spots already there. What data exists to support that we actually have a problem to be solved about parking for visitors? Why do we need more downtown parking "closer" to destinations? How close is sufficient? Have you documented how many workers at downtown businesses are already voluntarily park in the available spots farther from their front doors in order to leave the "closer" spaces available for shoppers? Implement that "free" solution first. How about incentivizing having local patrons park in farther-away spots via discounts on their dining bills?
