1. Call to Order

President of Council Wooldredge called to order the workshop of Hudson City Council at 7:30 p.m., in accordance with the Sunshine Laws of the State of Ohio, O.R.C. Section 121.22.

2. Correspondence and Council Comments

Mr. Sutton provided an update on the donation received from Hudson Garden Club for tree plantings.

Mr. Foster provided an update on the Planning Commission meeting that was held on September 13, 2021.

Mrs. Bigham stated the Cemetery Board will be hosting a Luminary event on October 9, 2021 from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Mr. Wooldredge asked Council members to inform Ms. Howington or himself if they are not able to make a meeting due to some important items coming forward.

3. Discussion Items

A. <u>21-0076</u> Downtown Development Phase 2 Update (Heinen's)

<u>Brief Description:</u> Representatives from Fairmont Properties will be in attendance to discuss the proposed Heinen's Store and their conceptual plans for the Downtown Phase 2 properties.

Mr. Ruttenberg and Mr. Fishman, Fairmont Properties, provided information on their proposed conceptual plans for the Downtown Phase 2 properties. Discussion followed that included phasing, timeline, public input, plans for current Heinen's property, floor plan of Townhomes, and market research. There was Council consensus for staff to begin working with Fairmont Properties to outline the process, costs associated with the sale and purchase of the land, and timeframe for discussion at the September 21, 2021, Council meeting.

B. <u>21-0073</u> Use of American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) Funding
