

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CHANGE ORDER TO THE CONTRACT WITH DELTA INDUSTRIAL SERVICES INC., FOR THE REPAINTING OF ADDITIONAL FIRE HYDRANTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 17-62, adopted by this Council on April 4, 2017, the City Manager advertised for bids and entered into a contract in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 for repainting of the fire hydrants on the Akron Water System with Delta Industrial Services Inc.; and

WHEREAS, City staff has recommended that the scope of the project be expanded to include repainting of all fire hydrants on the Akron Water System, as well as the fire hydrants on the Cleveland Water System, to take advantage of the low bid price, which the vendor has agreed to extend; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that it is necessary to amend the aforesaid contract in accordance with a recommendation of the City Manager to authorize additional funds as a change order for said additional costs in the amount of \$22,612.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: A change order in the amount of \$22,612 to the contract for fire hydrant repainting with Delta Industrial Services Inc., Cleveland, Ohio, is approved.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Hudson, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to complete the work during this construction season and to realize a cost savings to the City; wherefore, this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, except that six (6) affirmative votes shall be required if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
