

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE STATE ROUTE 91 NORTH TURN LANE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT (PID NO. 93822); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the project will include the addition of left turn lanes at Valley View Road, Herrick Park Drive, and Hines Hill Road, resurfacing of SR 91 from Brandywine Drive to Middleton Road, the installation of a sidewalk on the east side of the road, and bike lanes on both sides of the road from Brandywine Drive to Middleton Road; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation has agreed to provide funding in the amount of \$3,025,000.00 to the City to offset a portion of the City's costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality, requesting the submission of construction bids for the SR 91 North Turn Lane Improvements Project (PID No. 93822) in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's Office.

Section 2: The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract or contracts on behalf of the City, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate of Four Million Eight Hundred Sixty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Forty Four Dollars and Thirty Four Cents (\$4,867,744.34) for construction.

Section 3: The City Manager is authorized to add a 6% contingency amount, based upon the construction cost, to the contract or contracts with the lowest and best bidder.

Section 4: The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract or contracts if deemed necessary to do so.

Section 5: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to move forward with this Resolution in order to meet Project deadlines as determined by the Ohio Department of Transportation ; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
