


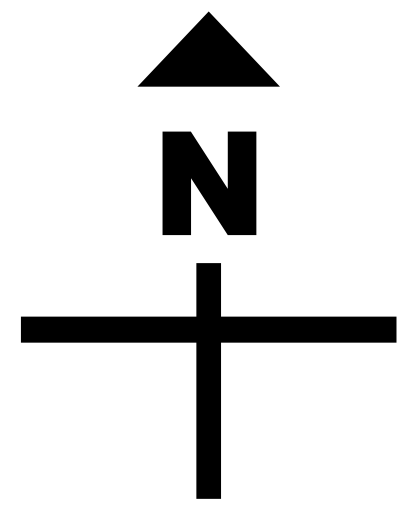

Further Description of Important Features Low gable; symmetrical facade; frieze; center chimney; one-story north wing; 6/6 double-hung windows; quarter-round lunettes at each side of upper front facade window; small windows extending into frieze on side; shelf entablature, pilaasters at entry on north side. *endangered by proposed widening of S. R. 91 through Historic District.			
43. History and Significance Built by Benjamin Whedon, who came to Hudson with Owen Brown from Connecticut in 1805. Valuation of \$235 appears on 1828 tax records. Built as wedding gift for John Whedon, son of Benjamin. Mrs. E. E. Rogers, daughter of John Whedon, was born here in the 1830's, was married here and lived in the house all of her life. Small wing was once a tax office.			
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings Barn, used as garage. Very close to road, S. R. 91, very heavy traffic. Picket fence separates house from road.

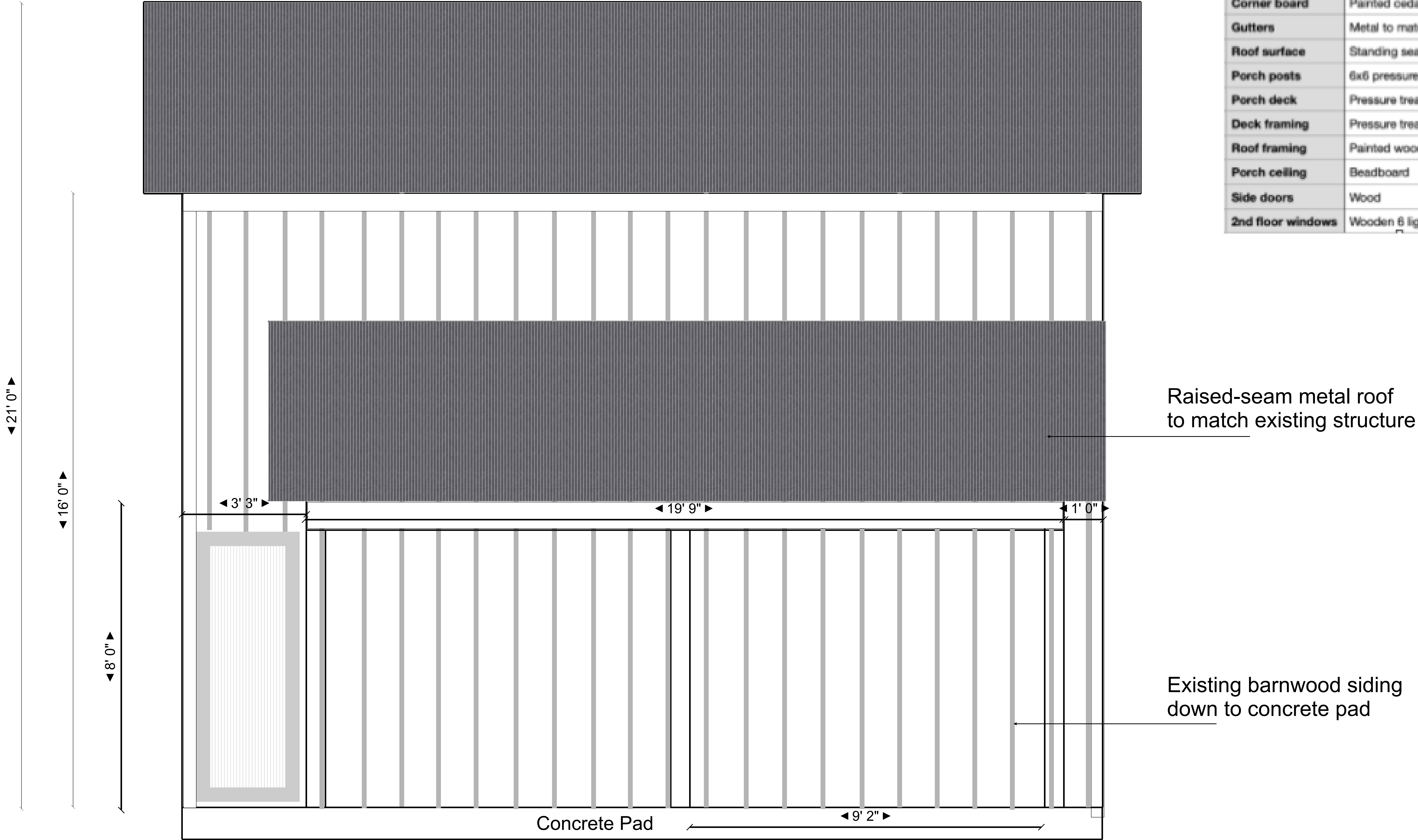
