## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1040.14 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES. REVISING WATER RATES FOR WATER SERVICE PROVIDED TO CUSTOMERS OUTSIDE OF CITY LIMITS

**Brief Description:** This Ordinance will amend the City's water rates to charge an additional 50% to the water rates for customers outside of City limits unless an agreement setting other rates exists.
