

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH QCI GROUP FOR CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SUPPORT SERVICES FOR THE STATE ROUTE 91 NORTH TURN LANE PROJECT (PID 93822); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, having evaluated the proposals and qualifications of four (4) consulting firms, staff recommends authorizing the City Manager to enter into a professional services contract with QCI Group of Bedford, Ohio, for construction administration support services for the SR 91 North Turn Lane Project (PID 93822); and

WHEREAS, this Council wishes to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with QCI Group for said professional services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with QCI Group of Bedford, Ohio, for professional services to perform construction administrative support services for the SR 91 North Turn Lane Project (PID 93822) in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Ninety-Three Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-One Dollars and Seventy-Two Cents (\$293,691.72), which includes a five percent (5%) contingency for scope of service changes that may occur.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to move forward with this Resolution in order to meet Project deadlines as determined by the Ohio Department of Transportation; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
