A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 22-130 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE STATE OF OHIO FOR INSPECTION SERVICES FOR THE MUNICIPAL BRIDGES (PID 117554) WITHIN THE CITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson, Ohio has determined the need for Bridge Inspection Services, including, but not limited to routine inspections, element level inspections, critical findings reports, fracture critical member inspections, load rating calculations and reports, weight limits posting sign recommendations, scour assessments, scour plan of actions, development of fracture critical plans, and underwater dive inspection reports if needed; and,

WHEREAS, the project is based on the available funds provided by ODOT aimed at assisting the City in reaching compliance with State and Federal laws and policies for bridge inspection; and,

WHEREAS, the project specifics (program duration, PID number, and consultant scope of services as found in Exhibit A shall be provided to the designated City's Contractual Agent via email sent by ODOT Office of Structural Engineering (OSE); and,

WHEREAS, ODOT will seek additional funds to renew the project in future years, and, if such funds are allocated, ODOT will send an email with the Project specifics to the City's Contractual Agent seeking approval for the new Project. ODOT will not proceed with any Project that does not have written authorization via email from the City's designated Contractual Agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

- <u>Section 1:</u> That the City hereby requests and grants consent to the Director of Transportation to proceed with the Bridge Inspection Program.
- <u>Section 2:</u> Being in the public interest, the City hereby gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the subject project.
- <u>Section 3:</u> The City has and shall continue to cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above-described project as follows:
 - A. The State shall assume and bear 100% of all of the cost for Bridge Inspection Program Services requested by the City and agreed to by the State. Eligible Bridge Inspection Services are described in the Consultant's Scope of Services Task Order Contract (Exhibit A).
 - B. Further, the City agrees to pay 100% of the cost of those features which are not included in Exhibit A. Those features may include but not limited to the purchasing

and erecting the recommended weight limits postings signs, the implementation of critical findings reports such as partial or total bridge closures, the implementation of the scour plan of actions. When recommendations affect public safety, ODOT expects full implementation by the City.

- C. As of October 2019, FHWA requires installing weight limits posting signs within 30 days from the official date of the approved recommendations.
- D. The City understands that timely implementation is essential to the success of this program.
- <u>Section 4:</u> The City agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations.
- <u>Section 5:</u> The City approves the Director's plans for the additional above-described work and desires the Director of Transportation to proceed with the entire aforesaid improvement project.
- Section 6: That the City shall enter into a contract with the State, and that the City Manager be and is hereby authorized to execute said contract or related paperwork for PID No. 117554 and the described project and/or work.
- <u>Section 7:</u> That the City shall promptly transmit to the Director of Transportation a fully executed copy of this Resolution.
 - Section 8: That the above recitals are fully incorporated as findings herein.
- Section 9: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 10: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the timely submission of the necessary paperwork in order to complete this project, to promote highway safety and/or immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the community and shall therefore take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
