A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF HUDSON TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE SUMMIT SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT (SWCD) TO ENCOURAGE COOPERATION TOWARDS THE ATTAINMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE GOALS IN THE COMMUNITY'S NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PHASE II MUNICIPAL STORM WATER PERMIT.
