

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE
A CHANGE ORDER TO THE CONTRACT WITH MOODY'S OF
DAYTON FOR WATER WELL MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS; AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson previously entered into a contract with Moody's of Dayton for water well maintenance and repairs; and

WHEREAS, while performing routine preventive maintenance on one of the City's water production wells, the contractor identified a need to perform emergency repair work to the well casing and additional work required to complete the project in accordance with City specifications and standards; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to authorize a change order to the existing contract with Moody's of Dayton to allow for the completion of the additional emergency work; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it in the best interest of the City to proceed with the change order to ensure the continued reliability and safety of the City's water well maintenance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio that: and,

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a change order to the contract with Moody's of Dayton, Inc. for water well maintenance and casing repairs, in an amount not to exceed \$127,400.00, including contingency, and upon terms approved by the City Manager and the City Solicitor.

Section 2. The City Manager is further authorized to execute all documents and take all necessary actions in accordance with the terms outlined in this Resolution.

Section 3. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of life, property, public health, safety, public peace, and the general welfare of the City and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to enter this agreement in a timely fashion due to emergent need of the repairs to the City's water source and well; wherefore, this legislation shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage, provided it receives five (5) affirmative votes of members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes are required if all members are present; otherwise it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
