A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 22-6 TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO RE-ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE STOW AND MIDDLETON ROADS TRAFFIC SIGNAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 22-6, passed by this Council on January 18, 2022, the City Manager was authorized to advertise for competitive bids and enter into a contract for the Stow and Middleton Roads Traffic Signal Construction Project;

WHEREAS, due to higher bid prices, staff desires to increase the previously authorized Engineer's estimate to two hundred fifty-three thousand two hundred sixty-one dollars and eight cents (\$253,261.08), which includes a 5% contingency amount.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

- Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to re-advertise both for a period of at least once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality and for a period of three (3) consecutive weeks on the Municipal website, requesting the submission of construction bids for the purpose of seeking the lowest and best bidder for the Barlow Community Center Dam Improvements Project and in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's Office.
- Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter a contract or contracts and sign all necessary documents on behalf of the City in an amount to be appropriated by Council, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids and to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The City Manager is authorized to add a 5% contingency amount to the contract with lowest and best bidder.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.
- Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to move forward with this Resolution in order to construct this project later this summer; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
