A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH CENTURY EQUIPMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson's Ellsworth Meadows Golf Club is in need of six (6) turf utility vehicles to meet the maintenance needs of the golf course during the 2018 growing season; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson has the authority to purchase equipment through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program which entity employs competitive bidding processes for equipment; and

WHEREAS, the City has obtained a price quote from Century Equipment, Twinsburg, Ohio, an authorized State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program vendor under State Term Contract # STS515800261, for the purchase of six (6) turf utility vehicles in an amount of \$56,022.00 for the purpose of replacing equipment at the end of its useful life; and

WHEREAS, this Council has appropriated the funds necessary for the purchase of said equipment to replace equipment in the City's Golf Course Division.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized to enter into a purchase agreement with Century Equipment, Twinsburg, Ohio, under the State of Ohio Procurement State Term Schedule Contract No. STS515800261 for the purchase of six (6) turf utility vehicles in an amount not to exceed \$56,022.00, and as said amount has been appropriated in the City budget.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that the aforesaid purchase must be made as soon as possible to secure the lowest price; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council elected thereto, or six (6) affirmative votes if all
