## 1. Call to Order

# 2. Correspondence and Council Comments

Mrs. Bigham thanked the administrative staff, and the Public Works and Engineering Departments for coordinating the road tour that was held on May 22, 2021. She further commended everyone for all of their efforts, and noted the many projects that will be happening this year to benefit the residents of Hudson. Mr. Wooldredge also thanked staff and stated that there is a lot of work being done this year and the coming years to improve the roads within Hudson.

# A. 21-0043 Agricultural Use Regulations - Draft Land Development Code Amendment

**Brief Description:** Council discussion regarding possible Land Development Code amendments related to agricultural use regulations.

Mr. Sugar provided an explanation on the proposed changes. Topics of discussion included fencing, raised garden beds, hoop houses, agricultural use setbacks, farmer's roadside stands, beekeeping, keeping of chickens, and use allowances. Mr. Sugar stated that a redline draft will be presented to Council in July.

## B. 21-0024 Recreation Center

**Brief Description:** Continued discussion on a Recreation Center has been requested by Councilwoman Nicole Kowalski.

Mrs. Kowalski asked for Council input on identifying 3 to 4 recreation center options and staff's assistance with obtaining costs associated with them. She further stated that once they have this information, then it could be included in community outreach to see if this is something that the residents are interested in. There was discussion on determining if there is a need for a recreation center and staff availability to put together a cost analysis. Ms. Howington stated that she could have staff put together an inventory of amentities currently in the area and then return to Council at a later date for further direction.

# A. 21-61 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO TEMPORARILY EXTEND THE TERM OF THE PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED AMENDMENT TO THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

WITH THE ALLSTATE INSURANCE COMPANY.

**Brief Description:** In 2019 City Council approved the third amendment to the 2012 development agreement with the Allstate Insurance Company located on Executive Parkway in Hudson Ohio. The third amendment provided for a two (2) year economic development electric rate extension that commenced on June 30, 2019 and is set to terminate on July 1, 2021. Staff recommends a temporary extension of the termination date of the third amendment until September 1, 2021 to give City Council ample time to review and discuss the 2021 HPP Rate and Cost of Service Study.
