OFFERED BY: MAYOR CURRIN

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF STOW FOR COOPERATION AND COST SHARING FOR THE RESURFACING OF NORTON ROAD BETWEEN YOUNG ROAD AND STOW ROAD; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the proposed project is to resurface Norton Road between Young and Stow Roads which is located between the City of Hudson and City of Stow borders;

WHEREAS, under an agreement between the two cities, the City of Stow is taking the lead to enter into agreements for the work and to administer the same and the estimated costs for which the City of Hudson would be responsible for this project is approximately \$50,000 and which this Council has appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter into an agreement with the City of Stow for cooperation and cost sharing for the project to resurface Norton Road between Young Road and Stow Road.

SECTION 2. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to perform this project in this construction season for the safety of the motoring public; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
