

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH MUTUAL HEALTH SERVICES (MHS) FOR CERTAIN HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN SERVICES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson provides certain health benefits, including medical and prescription drug coverage, to regular full-time city employees; and

WHEREAS, the City has historically been fully insured for medical and prescription drug claims, but moved to a self-insured model in 2025 because it was more cost-effective and maintained the employee contribution percentage at 15%; and

WHEREAS, the top proposal for the 2026 self-insured plan year is a combination of Nationwide Life Insurance for stop loss insurance, Mutual Health Services for claims administration, and TrueRX for prescription drug administration; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager and staff recommend entering a health benefit plan contract with Mutual Health Services (MHS) for claims administration for the period of January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter a health benefit plan contract with Mutual Health Services (MHS) for claims administration for the period of January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026 with said contract being in a form acceptable to the City Manager and City Solicitor.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of City residents and its staff, and because the open enrollment period for the City staff's health insurance is targeted for November 3 through November 17, 2025, and to support the continued operations of the City administration and shall, therefore, be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives an affirmative vote of at least six (6) members of the Council for its enactment if seven (7) are present, or an affirmative vote of at least five (5) members if only five (5) or six (6) members are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
