9. Public Comments

Ms. Ela Mody, 6254 Wessington Drive, and Ms. Caroline Bird, 7406 Hudson Park Drive, spoke about the climate crisis, presented a Report Card for the City of Hudson, and expressed concerns about impacts on future generations. They shared their passion for the environment and explained their involvement with the iMatter network. They urged City Council to consider passing a Climate Inheritance Resolution. (see comments and hand-outs attached to record copy of these minutes). Mayor Basil thanked the students for their passion and hard work. He said that elected officials and staff will review the materials provided.

10. Correspondence and Council Comments

None.

11. Report of Manager

As part of her ongoing recognition of veterans that serve our community, Ms. Howington recognized Mr. Charlie Schnoor for his years of service in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. She noted his service with the City since 1999, his current work as construction coordinator with the Engineering Department, and she announced his retirement at the end of the year.

Ms. Howington asked Mr. Knoblauch to review the Note Ordinances for debt issuance on the evening's agenda. Mr. Knoblauch explained each of the following Ordinances and said that the intent is to roll the notes over into a bond issue in the future:

- 1.) 17-192 for the Pasco building purchase and necessary improvements;
- 2.) 17-193 for the salt dome and bus garage costs that the City has incurred to date;
- 3.) 17-194 for water system improvements on North Main Street (debt renewal);
- 4.) 17-195 for street improvements on Barlow Road and North Main Street (debt renewal); and
- 5.) 17-196 for purchase of the Windstream property for Downtown Phase 2.

Mr. Knoblauch encouraged Council to pass all of these Ordinances, so that the City could proceed with closing the note issuance by year's end. He explained the need for certification of Ordinance No. 17-196 by the Hudson Community Improvement Corporation (HCIC), as required by the Ohio Revised Code. Ms. Howington said that staff is researching options for CIC certification, whether it is necessary to reconvene the HCIC or possibly use the Greater Akron Chamber of Commerce Regional CIC. Discussion followed concerning the City's debt capacity, the feasibility of transferring funds as an alternative to notes, and CIC certification of 17-196, further discussion of which was scheduled for the December 12, 2017, workshop.

Ms. Howington also recognized Mr. Mark Richardson, Community Development Director, who has decided to retire. She announced appointment of Mr. Greg Hannan as the new Community Development Director and Ms. Kris McMaster as the new City Planner. She also announced the hiring of a new Planner in the Community Development Department to fill a vacancy.
