#### **10.** Correspondence and Council Comments

*Mrs. Kowalski thanked the PTO for the Pancake Breakfast, provided an EAC update, and noted April 22 for the Earth Week celebration.* 

*Mr.* Sutton thanked the students who spoke during public comments and the PTO for the Pancake Breakfast. He also provided a Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee update, and stated that it was decided that Scott Ruffer would not be replaced on the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee. Mr. Sutton also noted that the Ohio Municipal League (OML) is asking cities and councils to support a resolution for federal rail safety changes.

*Mrs.* Heater echoed Mr. Sutton's support of the OML resolution. She received comments about train safety and said that this is one way we can take action.

*Mr.* Banweg also received questions about train safety and would support the OML resolution. He also thanked the PTO and the community for the number of veterans applying to Commission.

*Mr.* Foster also voiced his thanks to the PTO and support for the OML resolution. He noted that the Tax Incentive Review Committee met and would bring forward something to Council soon. Mr. Foster also mentioned that a city employee was injured by a speeding car and cautioned drivers to slow down and pay attention.

*Mr.* Ruffer thanked all the Councilmembers for their support and commented on the large number of volunteers for the Pancake Breakfast.

Mayor Anzevino stated that he would participate in a Mayor's Association call tomorrow regarding rail safety. He will also be talking to another Cub Scout group Friday afternoon and congratulated two new Eagle scouts.

## 11. Report of Manager

*Mr.* Sheridan spoke about the OML train safety email and updating the City's emergency incident plan. He also noted that the survey regarding the SR91 South sidewalk under the Norfolk Southern bridge will be open until March 14 and staff will discuss the results at the next workshop.

*Mr.* Sheridan stated that ODOT staff worked with Norfolk Southern to reduce the cost of the sidewalk, which would bring the cost down to \$204,840.
