A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE CITY OF HUDSON TO SELL BY INTERNET AUCTION PERSONAL PROPERTY, INCLUDING OFFICE FURNITURE AND OTHER PROPERTY REFERENCED IN REVISED CODE §721.15 WHICH ARE NO LONGER NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE OR ARE OBSOLETE OR UNFIT FOR THE USE FOR WHICH THEY WERE ACQUIRED DURING THE PURCHASE OF 94 OWEN BROWN STREET.

WHEREAS, the City acquired personal property during the purchase of 94 Owen Brown Street that is obsolete and not needed; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City to sell the foregoing property as it is presently unneeded, obsolete and/or unfit for use by the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City has received pricing from several local auctioneers which have recommended and provided pricing for an online auction of the items acquired through the purchase of 94 Owen Brown Street per the attached list of items; and,

WHEREAS, Hudson City Ordinance 208.03 establishes that the City Council must approve the list of items to be auctioned.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the personal property acquired by the City during the purchase of 94 Owen Brown Street, such as furniture and other property, identified on Exhibit "A," which is incorporated herein, is hereby found to be unfit, obsolete and/or unneeded property.

SECTION 2: That it is in the best interests of the City of Hudson and its operations to sell the property identified in Exhibit "A."

SECTION 3: That the City Manager and/or his designee are hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforesaid personal property in a reasonably commercial fashion, more specifically in an online auction as previously authorized and contracted.

SECTION 4: That the internet auction shall satisfy the statutory minimum of ten (10) days (including Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays) for bidding on the property.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: Advertising for the internet auction is hereby directed and shall be accomplished in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code and the City of Hudson legislation on this topic.

<u>SECTION 6</u>: That no proceeds from the internet sales shall be paid in cash, rather all proceeds shall be delivered to the Finance Director or his designee by cashier or bank check, or electronic transfer to the Village's general fund with verification of receipt delivered to the Finance Director or his designee.

SECTION 7: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 8: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 9: This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
