# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES DIVISION OF FORESTRY FOR A LAKE ERIE WATERSHED CANOPY RESTORATION GRANT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

**Executive Summary:** Funds supplied by the USDA Forest Service are intended to aid local jurisdictions in the response and recovery of urban forests from the Emerald Ash Borer and require a 50% match. The planting of trees along public right-of-way or on other public lands are the only eligible reimbursement costs. Cities located entirely or partially within the Cuyahoga River Area of Concern or watersheds that drain to the Area of Concern are eligible to submit proposals for consideration. The goal of the program is to replace ash trees, improve watershed health, enhance quality of life, promote urban forestry benefits, support comprehensive community tree care programs, and promote Ohio arboriculture and landscape industries.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF \$466,667 OF NOTES, IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING COSTS OF IMPROVING CITY PROPERTY CONSTITUTING THE SITE OF THE FORMER CUYAHOGA COUNTY YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CENTER BY PERFORMING SITE CLEARANCE, IMPROVEMENT AND PREPARATION AND PLACING THE SITE IN A CONDITION FOR USE AND OPERATION FOR CITY PURPOSES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

In 2014, we paid down on the note to \$700,000. We are now paying down the note by \$233,333 leaving a balance of \$466,667.
