A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR HER DESIGNEE, TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR A COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES (COPS) GRANT FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice provides funding for community oriented policing services; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice could provide funding in the form of a Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Anti-Heroin Task Force Grant to hire a patrol officer to allow a current experienced officer to be transferred to the detective bureau to work specifically on drug enforcement and investigation, with assignment to the Summit County Drug Task Force.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1:</u> The City Manager, or her designee, is authorized to apply to the U.S. Department of Justice for a COPS Anti-Heroin Task Force Grant for the reasons set forth in the recitals to this Resolution.

<u>Section 2:</u> This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare of the City and its residents and for the reason that it is necessary to apply for this grant without delay to timely meet the deadline for submission of the application and to enhance the possibility of receiving the same; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
