A RESOLUTION RETROACTIVELY AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A GRANT AGREEMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE HUDSON INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, Office of Budget and Management, has awarded a grant to the City of Hudson through the One Time Strategic Community Investment Grant Fund, for the purposes of supporting the City's development and construction of an inclusive playground; and

WHEREAS, it was necessary that the grant agreement be executed by the City Manager after the award was announced; and

WHEREAS, the project is in the best interest of the City of Hudson, Ohio and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. That the City Manager is hereby retroactively authorized to execute the One Time Strategic Community Investment Grant Agreement with the State of Ohio, Office of Budget and Management.
- Section 2. That the City Manager, Fiscal Officer and their designees are hereby authorized and directed to execute all necessary paperwork to fulfill the requirements of the Grant Agreement.
- <u>Section 3</u>. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.
- Section 4. That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 5. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and to allow for the timely submission of the required application, as well as the continued operations of the City Public Works Department and other departments and shall, therefore, be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives an affirmative vote of at least six (6) members of the Council for its enactment if seven (7) are present, or an affirmative vote of at least five (5) members if only five (5) or six (6) members are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
