

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE JESSE DRIVE STORM WATER POND MODIFICATIONS PROJECT.

WHEREAS, an existing, private property storm water management pond located within the City of Hudson requires upsizing to increase capacity to aid in alleviating downstream flooding (“the Jesse Drive Storm Water Pond Modifications Project”); and

WHEREAS, the City administration has already undertaken part of the project design, and the specifications are being developed; and

WHEREAS, the City administration seeks approval to proceed with the final design, bidding, and award of a construction contract for the Jesse Drive Storm Water Pond Modifications Project in order to have the construction begin in the spring of 2026; and

WHEREAS, the project’s scope of work is estimated at \$200,000, which includes a 10% contingency; and

WHEREAS, the 2022 Policy for Work on Private Property has been reviewed and found to apply to this project; and

WHEREAS, the upsizing of this existing, private property storm water management pond is in the best interest of the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of three (3) weeks on the City of Hudson website, requesting the submission of bids for the purpose of acquiring the lowest and best bidder in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Manager’s office for the Jesse Drive Storm Water Pond Modifications Project.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into contracts on behalf of the City with the lowest and best bidder on the Jesse Drive Storm Water Pond Modifications Project, so long as it is in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor and subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor.

Section 3. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders.

Section 4. That the above recitals are fully incorporated as findings herein.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
