

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE BRANDYWINE DRIVE CATCH BASIN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to install two new storm sewer inlets on the south side of Brandywine Drive between N. Main Street and Pitkin Drive to reduce storm water spread within the roadway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of at least two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality requesting the submission of bids for the Brandywine Drive Catch Basin Improvement Project in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's office.

Section 2: The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract or contracts on behalf of the City, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate.

Section 3: The City Manager is authorized to add a 10% contingency amount to the contract with the lowest and best bidder.

Section 4: The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.

Section 2: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the Brandywine Drive Catch Basin Improvement Project as soon as possible for the work to be done during this construction season; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto or six affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
