

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 410.09, SCHEDULE IX, OF THE TRAFFIC CODE TO AMEND THE LIST OF STREETS DESIGNATED AS PARKING TIME LIMITED IN DESIGNATED PLACES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, following the Hudson Traffic Safety Committee review and approval, the City is recommending the placement of two signs be erected on N. Oviatt Street designating the east side of the road from the intersection of Aurora Street to the existing Middle School Driveway (approximately 300 ft. south of the intersection) to be No Parking Between the Hours of 7:30 to 9:30 a.m. & 2:30 to 4:30 p.m., Hudson School days and amending Section 410.09, Schedule IX of the Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes that the above referenced amendments to the Traffic Code as set forth in this Ordinance are in the best interests of the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Section 410.09, Schedule IX, of the Traffic Code is hereby amended only as designated below:

“410.09 SCHEDULE IX – PARKING TIME LIMITED IN DESIGNATED PLACES

The following are the streets and portions of streets in the City on which parking is limited:

Street	Side Restricted	From	To/Position to Curb	Time of Day
No parking during specified times:				
N. Oviatt St.	East	The Middle School Driveway (300 ft. south)	Aurora St.	Between the hours of 7:30 to 9:30 am & 2:30 to 4:30 pm, Hudson School Days. (2 No Parking Signs)

Section 2: Those provisions of Section 410.09, Schedule IX, of the Codified Ordinances of the City that were in effect prior to the effective date of this Ordinance and that are in conflict with Section 1 above are hereby repealed and shall no longer have any effect to the extent that they are inconsistent with the amendments adopted in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: This Ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents and motorists in the City and for the further reason the aforementioned traffic pattern modifications need to be immediately implemented in order to improve the safety of the motorist and school buses to this area prior to school starting; wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage, provided it receives five (5) affirmative votes of members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes are required if all members are present; otherwise it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
