Hauler Details by City

Macedonia: Single hauler contract with Republic Services. Extended the contract for another five years in December 2019.

Cost is \$14.35 a month this year and rise to \$16.25 in the fifth year. It offers a \$1 Senior Citizen discount. Republic provides a 95-gallon trash container and a 65-gallon recycling tote. If residents need a second 95-gallon trash container or a second recycling container, they must pay an additional \$60 for each. According to Republic: It offers unlimited trash collection including bulk items and furniture. The city offers cardboard recycling at Longwood Park Ball Fields.

Twinsburg: In March 2019 the city approved a three-year trash and recyclables contract with Waste Management. The company had previously had a five-year contract with the city. The city pays Waste Management directly. Waste Management provides trash and recycling bins. The city paid Waste Management about \$1.18 million in 2018 and that figure increased by 3 percent in 2019. The monthly rate for solid waste collection per home was \$9.26 in 2019, rising to \$9.54 in 2021. Waste Management will pick up one large item a week. Other items should be broken down to four-foot lengths. Six bags of yard waste are permitted each week. The current rate for recycling per home would be increased by 42 cents to \$2.83 in 2019, with the rate increasing to \$2.91 per home in 2020 and \$3 in 2021. Of that 42 cents, 23 cents is a recycling offset fee intended to help defray the cost of removing recycling contamination and processing recyclables, as well as the reduced value of recycling commodities. Commencing Dec. 1, 2019, and each Dec. 1 thereafter, the parties would negotiate any further increases or decreases in the recycling offset fee based upon market conditions at that time. Waste Management officials said the recycling offset fee is being added because of China's ban on import of certain products generated by the global recycling industry and the 0.5 percent contamination limits. The city offers large recycling bins, which it suggests be used for cardboard, behind the school buses next to Chamberlin Middle School.

Solon: The city is part of a consortium in Cuyahoga County that bids for trash and recycling services. The city has a sanitation department and picks up the trash and recyclables. they pay a disposall feee to Republic to dump the waste at the Republic transfer station. Recycling is picked up by Kimbe at no charge. Kimble sells the materials and provides a percentage back to the city, but has been unable to get muhc for the recycling recrnyly, paying the city onlt \$158 this past year. The contracts are up for renewal in June 2020 and will likely result in having to pay for recycling. The 64-gallon recycling bin and 95-gallon trash bin are owned and issued by the city. A second 95-gallon bin can be rented for \$70. Currently the trash goes to Republic and the recycling to Kimble. There is no separate charge to residents for trash or recycling pickup. see Solon tab for additional

Aurora: Three-levels of Service: 10-bag service: Costs \$15.00 per quarter. The 30-gallon bags are sent by Rumpke. \$25 charge for bulk items. 60-gallon service: Costs \$36.90 per quarter. \$25 charge for bulk items. Additional charge for bulk items. Recycling is mandatory. Residents pay \$31.20 a year to Portage County Waste Management. The contract runs through 2021. Super Service: Costs \$37.65 per quarter. Disposal of up to 15 30-gallon bags plus bulk items at no additional cost. People can use their own trash cans. A 96-gallon trash cart can be leased for \$3.50 a month. Recycling is mandatory. Residents pay \$31.20 a year to Portage County Waste Management.

Streetsboro: 5yr-contract; Recycling required. 96 gal tote: basic 3x30 gal full 10x30gal & 1 bulk item; additional 96 gal tote @ 49 /quarter; Pre-arranged charge for pick up of additional bulk items on regularly scheduled day; Recycling charge is added to quarterly sewage bill. Special program fee-paid rubbish residents @ <175% of poverty level has rubbish pick up at no cost, but pay \$2.10 /mo for recycling

Kent: Five-levels of Service: Residents can put out bags that they buy - a 10-pack is \$18.50. They can purchase those at city hall. Other charges are: \$9.20 a month for a 30-gallon can, \$10.30 a month for a 40-gallon can, \$13.40 a month for a 90-gallon bin and \$20.50 per month for a 90-gallon bin and unlimited bulk items and bags. Bulk items are extra for all but the highest monthly fee.

Stow: The city selected Kimble as its preferred hauler. "This arrangement provides uniformity of service, and reduces truck traffic on City streets," the city said. The current contract began September 2019. began September 2019. Rates are \$19.05 per month for curbside refuse and recycling pickup; \$39.35 per month for set-back pickup; \$4 per month plus \$4 per bag for bag pickup. Recycling costs are included with the refuse pickup fee. Bulk items are \$45 per item. If the item has freon, it is \$100 each. People can put out two bulk items per week. Residents can opt out of Kimble - The city said: "If you do not wish to subscribe to Kimble's service, you are required per the City of Stow to notify Kimble in writing of your intent to contract with another waste collection service that is licensed by the City of Stow and "OPT-OUT" of the City's preferred service. This notification can be done by checking "OPT-OUT" on the "Sign Up Card" and placing it in the mail. If you DO NOT opt out, you will automatically be included in the is new program with Kimble Company. If you have questions, call 1-800-201-0005." The city has a list of qualified haulers - it includes four that do residential pick up.

Republic (Hudson)- \$54.24/quarter. Includes 95-gallon tote for trash and 64-gallon tote for recyclable. Cost also includes brush pick up, any trash 4-foot long or less and bulk pickup (need to call for bulk pick up).

Waste Management (Hudson) - \$60.50 quarter for trash pickup; \$88.73 a quarter for trash and recycling. They provide a 95-gallon tote for trash and a 64-gallon tote for recyclables. If you are starting new service, there is a \$52.25 onetime charge for the containers. New customers get a lidded recycle container but those who have the open recycle bins (which all my neighbors have) can continue to use those. They are not required to change them. They do not do yard waste pickup. Bulk items are \$35 each and if you stick out more than one it is \$35 for the first one and \$15 for each additional one.

The website says it recycles glass.

Kimble (Hudson)- charges \$18.00 a week for one 96 gal bin or \$19.25 for a 96 gal bin and 3 bags of trash or 1 bulk item. Recycling is \$1.50 per week + fees for a 70 gal bin. The fees are about 1.25 week. So I pay \$20.75 for basic trash and recycling, and Kimble takes all colors of glass, paper, cardboard, metal cans and plastic #1 and #2.

AA (Hudson)- \$24 a month, which includes recycling, of plastic carboard and metal. They provide a bin if you want, but generally everyone uses their own cans for trash and recycling, mainly because they don't like the big bins. They would be "flexible" with yard waste and bulk - call and they might charge a few dollars more depending on the nature of the pickup
