

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH LOCKHART CONCRETE COMPANY FOR THE HUDSON DRIVE WATERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. (Hudson Option)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 18-42, passed by this Council on March 20, 2018, competitive bids were received for the extension of City of Hudson water, from the Metro RTA railroad tracks, along the Metroparks Hike & Bike Trail and then along Hudson Drive, by installing a new twelve-inch (12") watermain for the purpose of providing drinking water and fire suppression to properties along Hudson Drive near the Hudson Gate Drive intersection; and

WHEREAS, the City staff has recommended that the bid of Lockhart Concrete Company be accepted by this Council as being the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, this Council wishes to accept the bid of Lockhart Concrete Company as being the lowest and best bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The bid of Lockhart Concrete Company for extending City of Hudson water to properties along Hudson Drive near the Hudson Gate Drive intersection, being the lowest and best bid, is accepted and the City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with Lockhart Concrete Company for the total amount of Five Hundred Sixteen Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents (\$516,452.75), which includes amounts for contingencies relating to scope of services changes that may occur.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a Pipeline Occupancy Agreement with Metro RTA in an amount of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500) and additionally to pay railroad inspection fees to Metro RTA, estimated at Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000).

Section 3. The City Manager is authorized to enter into an Agreement with Ohio Edison for the purchase of an easement in an amount of Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000).

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to move forward with the extension of City of Hudson water by reason that the immediate construction of said improvement is necessary to provide an adequate supply of potable water and water for fire protection to the area served by said waterline; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
