6. Public Comments

Mr. Gregory Janik, 36 Thirty Acres, said that he spoke this week with the Park Board pertaining to property owned by Mr. John Carse, which is near his residence and adjacent to MacLaren Woods Park. He invited City officials to look at the property and consider acquiring the land in order to secure additional open space for the Parks. Additionally, Mr. Janik spoke against the concept of operating Ellsworth Meadows Golf Course as a responsibility of the Parks Department. He suggested the City sell the golf course and move forward, as Parks funding should not be used to run the golf course.

7. Correspondence and Council Comments

Mr. Smith provided an update on the Park Board, announcing that Ms. Rhonda Kadish has been elected as the new Chair. He said that two vacancies exist on the Park Board for which applications are being accepted, and he described a marketing research project currently being conducted by the Park Board.

Referring to earlier comments regarding Ellsworth Meadows, Mr. DeSaussure clarified that the City has been operating the golf course since 1999.

Mr. DeSaussure reminded citizens that current vacancies exist on the Tree Commission, Park Board, and the Personnel Advisory and Appeals Board, with applications due on March 28, 2014. In addition, he said the City will accept applications for a vacancy on the Cable TV Advisory Committee through April 18, 2014. He encouraged interested citizens to apply for these volunteer positions.

8. Report of Manager

Mr. Schroyer reviewed key projects and programs, including the Heritage Home Program, the availability of HCTV's program schedule online, and seasonal service activities (see report attached to record copy of these minutes).

Mayor Currin thanked Mr. Schroyer for his recent presentation on the State of the City, and he encouraged citizens to view the State of the City address on the City's website.
