



RESOLUTION NO. 13-110

**A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING “ADA COOPER MILLER LANE”
AS AN HONORARY STREET NAME AND PROVIDING FOR LOCATION OF A SIGN
ON FRANKLIN STREET AT THE INTERSECTION OF AURORA STREET.**

WHEREAS, Ada Cooper Miller was born in England on December 12, 1903, moved with her family to Hudson, Ohio, three months later, and has lived in Hudson since that time, a total of one hundred nine and one-half years; and,

WHEREAS, for approximately seventy five years, Ada worked for the family business, Cooper Florist, from which she supplied floral arrangements for Christ Church Episcopal, the Western Reserve Academy Chapel, and hundreds of Hudson weddings and proms; and,

WHEREAS, in 1938, Ada was elected to the Hudson School Board and served for forty years, including her service as President from 1954 until 1978, and during whose tenure, Hudson’s schools climbed to new educational heights, the concept of the Permanent Improvement Levy was born and passed, and land was purchased for the future development of the Schools Campus; and,

WHEREAS, Ada has served as a volunteer for most of her life and has been an active member of local organizations, including the Garden Club, Hudson Women's Club, Blossom Women of Hudson, Senior Citizens Club, and Episcopal Church Women of Hudson Christ Church Episcopal; and,

WHEREAS, for most of her life, Ada resided in the home at 139 Franklin Street in Hudson.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Hudson, Ohio, that the City Manager is authorized and directed to locate an honorary street name sign, designating “Ada Cooper Miller Lane,” the design of which is incorporated herein as Exhibit A, on Franklin Street at the intersection of Aurora Street; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Council, on behalf of itself and the residents of the City, recognizes that Ada Cooper Miller has lived in Hudson longer than any person in the history of the City and hereby thanks her for her many contributions to the Hudson community.
