OFFERED BY:

A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE CITY OF HUDSON'S FUNDING AMOUNT TO THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE STATE ROUTE 303 RESURFACING PROJECT (PID #82919); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State Route 303 resurfacing project includes the resurfacing and miscellaneous improvements to that roadway within the City of Hudson and the project is being sponsored, designed, managed and inspected by the Ohio Department of Transportation ("ODOT"); and

WHEREAS, as part of the original ODOT agreement with the City, the City was required to participate on the five-mile project with an estimated amount of \$331,368; and

WHEREAS, ODOT misapplied the amount of the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study funding assigned to this project and the error was discovered after this Council authorized a contract for the project; due to this error, the City of Hudson's financial participation in the project needs to be increased by \$50,450;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: This Council hereby authorizes an increase in the City of Hudson's local funding amount to the Ohio Department of Transportation for the State Route 303 resurfacing project in the amount of \$50,450.

Section 2: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council or its committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary for this important public improvement project to be completed at the earliest possible time for the safety of person travelling within the City; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto or six affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
